# **Electronic Cigarettes**

Also referred to as e-cigarettes, e-cigs, e-hookah, hookah pens or vape pens.





#### **Health Effects**

E-cigarettes deliver an aerosol containing nicotine, a highly addictive drug. The amount of nicotine in e-cigarettes varies widely, but can contain over 10mg (6 times the amount in a cigarette). The vapor also contains many other chemicals such as heavy metals and antifreeze, but the exact content is unknown because e-cigarettes are not regulated by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

## **Common Brands**

Blu, Vuse, Starbuzz, Imperial, NJoy, and MarkTen. Many of these are produced by the largest tobacco companies, which aim to maintain the cycle of nicotine addiction.

### **Variety**


Called e-cigs, e-hookah, hookah pens, vape pens, or by other names. They come in many shapes and sizes and are sometimes worn like a pen around the neck.

#### What's the tactic?

- Can look like cigarettes or ballpoint pens and are designed to deliver flavor, nicotine, and other chemicals to users.
- Come in kid-friendly flavors like bubblegum, pina colada and juicy peach.
- Available at the same retail locations as other tobacco products, using low prices and a variety of sweet flavors, which appeal to youth.
- State regulations prohibit the sale of e-cigarettes and other electronic nicotine delivery devices to minors, but do not regulate their content.

It's a fact: Research shows that kids who shop at stores with tobacco two or more times a week are 64% more likely to start smoking than their peers who don't.
